

If you read this article in the Spring 2018 *Hemalina*, you know it contains the names of at least 412 daylily cultivars. If you have not read it before, read it there first. This is the answer sheet. The red and green highlights are used to identify and/or separate unique cultivar names within the story, while underlining and/or double underlining identifies names within other names to the best extent possible. The full alphabetical list of cultivar names found in the story follows within this article.

## ***What We Have Here Is – Failure To Communicate***

There is no place like home, and frankly my dear your fat and sassy, loose lips are headed there by special delivery right after they get a fist bump from this blue haired girl! Welcome to dreamland, sweet lips!

Maizie – Go ahead, make my day! I'm little but mighty, and I will have no regrets about taking you on!

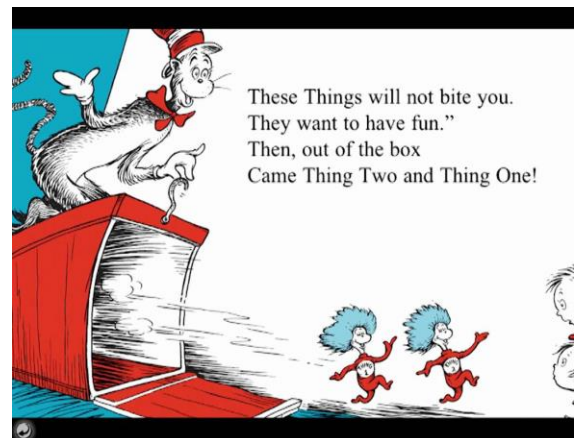

Just **remember**, however, this is **no contest!** You may think **you win**, but there is no **prize winner** who gets **prize money**, a **winner’s trophy**, or a **prize trophy** for finding them all – no **grand prize**, not even a **first prize!** Therefore, I do declare these to be my **famous last words** on this subject.
